MANDATE OF THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY

The broad scope of responsibility accorded to the Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security is, as originally defined by Bill C-32:

"...to increase knowledge and understanding of the issues relating to international peace and security from a Canadian perspective, with a particular emphasis on arms control, disarmament, defence and conflict resolution; and to:

- a) foster, fund and conduct research on matters relating to international peace and security;
- b) promote scholarship in matters relating to international peace and security;
- c) study and propose ideas and policies for the enhancement of international peace and security; and,
- d) collect and disseminate information on, and encourage public discussion of issues of international peace and security."
