- Basic premise is that what is done in other countries needs to reflect what they want to do.
- Resources would need to be committed to the policy development process.

Candem

- Envisioned as a Board operating at arms length from Government. Membership on the Board would include civil society organizations, government. Relates to the UN and other international bodies and to both the Policy Coordination and Operational Coordination bodies.
- Reactive, rapid deployment role human rights experts, etc.
- Active role in training demands.

Operational Coordination

- Relates to other two bodies and directly with the target countries whose input is essential to deployment strategies. Ability to respond quickly, with flexibility.
- Relates to ongoing decisions within the country.
- Relates to the UN or other international groups.
- Maintains an inventory of resources, etc. Funding for specific country operations would be decentralized to a country "team" which would make decisions on how and where to channel funds most appropriately. Members of civil society would be part of this team.
