

Mr. Benidickson, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Transport, laid before the House,—Summary of a Revised Pension Plan for the Canadian National Railways.

The following Questions on the Order Paper were passed by the House as Orders for Return, under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44, and Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers accordingly:—

By Mr. Fraser:—1. Has a commission been set up to inquire into fires which destroyed defence properties and defence supplies?

2. If so, what are the names of the members of such commission?

3. Has the commission made a report? If so, what were the findings?

4. What was the total loss by fire in defence buildings, material and equipment in 1951, at what places did fires occur and what was the amount of loss in each instance?

5. What was the total loss by fire in defence buildings and material and equipment during the first two months of 1952, where did fires take place and what was the amount of loss in each instance?

Mr. Campney, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of National Defence, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order forthwith.

By Mr. Lennard:—1. How many fur pelts were imported into Canada from January 1 to December 31, 1951?

2. How many of each variety and from what countries were they imported?

Mr. McIlraith, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Trade and Commerce, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order forthwith.

By Mr. Lennard:—1. In what magazines, newspapers, or other periodicals, did the Federal Government advertise Government Annuities, during the period from January 1, 1951 to March 1, 1952?

2. What was the total cost of such advertising in each of these mediums?

By Mr. Charlton:—1. Has any shipment of merchandise packed in hay, straw, or any other raw product of the soil, reached Regina or any other point in Saskatchewan, from Europe during the last twelve months, which was not certified by a properly qualified and authorized Government Veterinarian of the country of origin, as being properly disinfected before shipment?

2. Are the clothes of immigrants entering Canada from any country where foot-and-mouth disease exists, disinfected at port of entry?

3. Have any cattle been imported from England, Ireland or Scotland, during the past twelve months? If so, on what date and under what conditions?
