off their farms. Our 33,000 farms maintain a population of 150,000. They produce 7,000,000 pounds of dairy butter, which is not bad for a small province. So I do not think we are so badly off in our province. We produce the finest apples grown in Canada, with a productive capacity of 2,000,000 barrels a year, the greater portion of which has in the past gone to the United Kingdom; but now that the whole of Canada has become acquainted with our apple juice, we are looking forward to markets for that product within Canada.

On motion of Mr. Isnor the debate was adjourned.
