BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Hon. Allan J. FISHERIES

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AGREEMENTS WITH RUSSIA RESPECTING NORTHEASTERN PACIFIC OCEAN—REQUEST FOR UNANIMOUS CONSENT TO MOVE MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

Mr. Frank Howard (Skeena): Mr. Speaker, pursuant to Standing Order 43 relating to the acceptance of motions by unanimous consent I would like to ask for consent, seconded by the hon. member for New Westminster but in conjunction with the Minister of Fisheries and Forestry who said that he would be glad to do so but has not done it yet, to move the following motion:

That the two draft agreements negotiated between fisheries experts of Canada and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics for resolving problems associated with Canadian and Soviet fishing operations in the northeastern Pacific Ocean, as referred to in a communiqué from the Department of Fisheries and Forestry dated October 21, 1970, be referred to the Standing Committee on Fisheries and Forestry.

Mr. Speaker: The hon. member has indicated the nature of his motion which, under Standing Order 43, requires the unanimous consent of the House. Is there such unanimity?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

Some hon. Members: No.

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Mr. Speaker: There are a few nays which indicate there is not unanimous agreement. Therefore the motion cannot be put.

TAX REVIEW BOARD BILL

FARM PRODUCTS MARKETING AGENCIES BILL

ESTABLISHMENT OF NATIONAL MARKETING COUNCIL AND AGENCIES

Hon. Allan J. MacEachen (for the Minister of Agriculture) moved for leave to introduce Bill C-176, to establish the National Farm Products Marketing Council and to authorize the establishment of national marketing agencies for farm products.
