Six o'clock.

62. If at six o'clock the business is not concluded, the Speaker, or the Chairman of the Committee of the Whole, leaves the Chair until half-past seven, saying, "It being six "o'clock, I leave the Chair." R. 13; B. 214.

More than one sitting on same day. 63. Sometimes, toward the close of the Session, it is deemed desirable to have more than one sitting (called distinct sittings) on the same day. The question then is: "It is "moved by the Honourable...., seconded" by the Honourable...., That when the "Senate adjourns at...it do stand adjourned "until..., the same to be a distinct sitting of the Senate."
