Harrington Fellowship, of similar amount, to help out the teaching; this may not be available in 1931-32, and if it is available its value will be reduced.

Provision for one teaching Fellowship of \$700. and four student assistantships at \$500 each would be decidedly useful for the next two years; two of the latter, and perhaps three, could be dropped after two years if found necessary.

For a graduate school entering into serious competition for students, these assistantships would be of great value in helping to get established. It has been found necessary to inform five qualified students so far that we could give them no menetary assistance here for next session, but it may not be too late to secure some of them and others will no doubt apply. There are at present nine graduate students registered in Geology.
