

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE IV.

It shall be the duty of the W. P., who by virtue of his Office is head of the Section, to appoint two Associate Patrons and a Chaplain, (members of the order of the Sons of Temperance) who shall render him such Constitutional assistance as he may require of them; and in his absence officiate in his place. They shall attend the meetings of the Section, and assist in properly conducting the same. The W. P. is empowered to make such decisions and impart such advice as he may deem necessary to carry out the principles of the Organization. He shall have power to suspend the Meetings of the Section for one week; grant permission to Parade and hold Public Meetings: and he shall be amenable for his acts to the Grand Section only.

ARTICLE V.

SEC. 1. It shall be the duty of the W. A., under the direction of the W. P., to preside over the Section; enforce an observance of the laws, rules, and usages of the Order; see that the Officers perform their respective duties; appoint all Committees not otherwise provided for; announce the result of all votes; call special meetings whenever ten members apply in writing for the same, provided the application be endorsed by the W. P.; sign all orders on the W. P. for such sums as may be necessary to pay the appropriation made by the Section, and perform such other duties as the Section or his charge may require of him.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the V. A. to render such assistance as the W. A. may require of him, and in his absence to act in his place.
