

The Ontario Power Company is In-stalling the fourth section of its pow-er house equipment which will be the largest unit for the generating of electricity in the world. Its capacity will be 12.500 horse power. It will be ready for operation in March and a fifth unit of equal size will be ready during April. The record-breaking generators of the Canadian Niagara Power Company are of but 10.000 horse power capacity, and those to be install-ed by the Electrical Development Com-pany will be of 12.000 horse power. The new machines of the Ontario Pow-er Company will probably hold the world's record for size for a long time to come.




