"For the first time in many years the extreme radical groups which have always contributed the most noise and a great deal of mischief, pitch their songs in a subdued key," according to a New York World correspondent at the American Federation of Labor convention at Atlantic City.

While a Buffalo editor believes that every day some new strike, or bomb explosion, or red-flag waving in this country or Canada confirms his belief that "Uion labor is in the hands of unscrupulous men whose political, social and economic principles stand on all fours with those of Lenine and Trotzky," the evidences of conservatism at the convention are many. W.'s, or kindred gentry will not be tolerated."
