# MAN O' WAR'S GAIT LIKE ST. SIMON'S

Analysis of Champion's Style as Shown in Race With Sir Barton.

It has been generally believed by racing men that in order to develop the greatest possible speed a horse has to gallop extended and low to the ground; in other words, what "high school" riders call "uncollected."

In his racing, and especially on the occasion of his last wonderful feat, the mighty Man o' War has disproved that idea, as proved in photographs made in his race against Sir Barton, showing the incomparable 3-year-old making a

The horse's four feet being exceedingly close together, there is no denying that he has a very high degree of natural collection. And it would be impossible for him, or any other horse, to make a 15-foot, leap—let alone a succession of louch leaps continued for a mile and a quarter—without being very highly collected, whether naturally or artificially. Another proof of his being collected is the height at which his head is carried, the lowest part of his chin being arely below a perpendicular drawn from his withers forward.

The fact that his reins are loose while in this posture proves also that he is not weighing on his rider's hands and that he is, consequently, altho running of such excessive speed, as light of houch, as a well-trained high school horse and his natural collection had consequently been improving by art, it would have included the neck, whichen might have been carried I elevaight.

If his legs from below the knees and hocks are hidden and only the parts of his body and legs above that are shown, Man o' War will appear to be performing the high school "air" called "Plaffer" instead of a racing gallop.

By contrasting Sir Barton's attitude as he vainly chases Man o' War, we see that, going low to the ground in approved racing style, this horse could not possibly execute the tremendous leaps which gave such an easy victory to his rivel, who, moreover, apparently went about his business very calmby, judging by his absolutely peaceful factal expression in the photograph.
