Three-year-old Champions. The Keating champions were the three-year-old colis Agitato and Search-light. The Steinway cold paced in 2.09¼ in 1896 and the following year Search-light won at the same point at Butte, Nontana. It was the showing of this horse which prompted Keating to appear on the eastern tracks in 1898 with Ana-cruda, Searchlight and Klatawah. Of the double champion makers, W. W. Marvin alone remains. His repre-sentative was William, one of the hand-somest and best racing pacers that ever turned for the word. As a three-year-old in 1913, Marvin gave him a record of 2.05. The following year Murphy re-duced the figures to 2.00% with Anna Bradford. In his four-year-old firm, William paced in two minutes, while as a five-year-old he made a race record of 1.534 in one of his matches with Directum I. Directum I.

Directum I. Among the trotters, Cresceus was the cnly stallion that became a world's champion. His mark of 2.02¼ was the limit at that gait from 1900 to 1903 when Lou Dillon started the two-minute list. In the pacing division, stallions have led the way since 1896. In the 25 years which have elapsed, three of them have been declared world's champions. They are John R. Gentry, Hal Pointer and Dan Patch. Dan Patch.

Dan Patch. No changes were made in the pacing records in 1920. 
