RESCINDING OF ORDER REMOVING EMERGENCY LOCATOR TRANSMITTERS FROM AIRCRAFT—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

Having regard to a directive issued by the Air Transport Commission earlier this year ordering the removal of emergency transmitters and crash site locators from both private and commercial aircraft, and having regard to at least two air crashes which occurred recently in central British Columbia involving both a rotary and a fixed wing aircraft resulting in extensive air rescue operations at monumental cost to the taxpayers, but more importantly respecting the fact that possible survivors of aircraft accidents frequently perish from exposure to the elements after the crash, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Vegreville (Mr. Mazankowski):

That the Ministry of Transport rescind the removal order immediately requiring all types of aircraft to carry the ELT equipment and that serious efforts be undertaken by the government to develop a power source for these transmitters which will not endanger the operation of the aircraft while in flight.
