During the year 454 specimens were received for examination from the Operating Room, the Surgical Wards and the Surgical Out-door. Of these the following may be mentioned as being of interest:—

Appendicitis:—

83 appendices in all were received for examination, and of these 58 were examined bacteriologically. Concerning the latter, it may be remarked that it was an almost constant occurrence to find in the contents of the appendix stained by Gram-Safranin, numerous cocci and bacilli, which on plating out refused to grow. In a few, organisms were obtained in the plates of uncertain character which were not followed out to identification.

The appendices were classified according to histological appearances, as follows:
