He had a bullet entered the back of the left ear and came out under the right jaw, shattering the bone and severing an artery.

ROOSEVELT'S NEW CABINET WILL BE OF STRONG TIMBER

President of the United States Furnishes Another Proof of His Shrewdness by His Choice of Advisors -- Roosevelt to Visit Panama and Cuba -- Changes in Customs of Washington Society.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 29, 1906.—When the cabinet had been reorganized and recruited according to the plans of the president he will have what is probably the strongest the most aggressive, and in a sense, the most metropolitan cabinet that has ever sat at the council table of the White House.

These cabinet changes are here considered from the standpoint of their effect on the administration with the Philippines, as provisional governor of Cuba, and as special envoy to the Vatican for the purchase of the Philippine friar lands.

Great changes have taken place in Washington society since the coming to the White House of the president and Mrs. Roosevelt. It is now being prepared for the voyage. It has luxurious quarters and a wireless telegraphic equipment, and it is expected that the president will not at any time be out of communication with this country.
