now faculties in Arts and Theology, numbering 14 professors and lecturers. The number of students attending lectures in the faculty of Arts, 1893–94, was 167. The number of students in Theology for the same year was 130.

The roll of graduates now numbers: In Arts, 696; in Theology, 110; in Law, 134; in Medicine, 1,670; or 2,612 in all.

The University holds real estate, buildings and furnishings valued at \$335,000, and a net productive endowment, after providing for all outstanding obligations, of \$290,000.

The consummation of federation has furnished the students of Victoria University with the advantages of a professoriate in Arts of 31 men, in addition to their own College staff of 11, placing the institution on a par with the best universities on the Continent. All the degrees, honors, scholarships and prizes of the University are open to students of Victoria College on the same terms as to those of University College. The attendance of students in Arts has largely increased, and the new relations are proving of the most cordial and satisfactory character.

THE UNIVERSITY OF MOUNT ALLISON COLLEGE is the corporate name of a group of connexional institutions, situated at Sackville, N.B., and comprising:

1. The University proper, or Mount Allison University, embracing faculties in Arts and Theology. The University building, erected in 1883, is an exceedingly handsome edifice of brown stone, with chapel, library, class-rooms, laboratories, etc. The need of enlarged and improved residential accommodation for students has long been felt, and that want has been supplied by the erection of a spacious University residence of brick, trimmed with stone, elegantly furnished and capable of accommodating upwards of one hundred
