The final number was a very realistic camp scene in which all the members of the troop took part and for which all scenic details were admirably attended to. During an interval in the programme refreshments were served and the tea used was kindly donated. The programme closed with the National Anthem. The proceeds of the entertainment will be used to buy equipment for the troop. Miss Margaret Newcombe, as accompanist, added materially to the evening's success.

Mackenzie King in this campaign, has become convinced that its doubts were without good reason and is now energetically supporting the Liberal candidate in Kingston. Toronto Saturday Night, a weekly periodical of high standard which has been aggressively supporting the Meighen Government, has recently changed front and adopted a neutral attitude. The Maclean publications, Toronto journals of importance, hitherto known as favorable to the Conservative cause, are now outspoken in their criticism of many of the attacks upon Hon.
