New York, Sept. 4.—The Associated Press today issues the following:—The British have driven home their push through the Wotan lines as far as the Canal Du Nord and as yet their progress is not reported checked.

The menace to both Cambrai and Douai may be indicated by the fact that the British are in a menacing one to the east of the German defences in the sector between the railway centres of Douai and Cambrai.

British Headquarters, Sept. 4.—Canadian Press dispatch from Reuter's (Ldn.) says that the German retreat is continuing.
