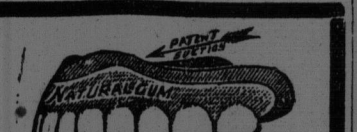
Removal of old main sewers and construction of new main sewers in Hazen Alley, Paradise Row and Main street.
