TO ENFORCE THE MEAT CARD SYSTEM

Even King and Queen Must Obey New Rule

Fighting Men Excepted—Plan a Great Success in London—Protest Against Fixed Prices of Certain Estates Is Probable

From king to costermonger, all England, except soldiers and sailors, must live by a meat card beginning Monday morning. His Majesty George V., King of England and Emperor of India, could no longer enjoy a pork chop or a slice of the good meat beef without presenting his meat card at the corner butcher's than could his humblest of subjects. And what goes for the king goes for Mary the Queen. This is an illustration of democracy refined by war's necessities.

England has taken to meat cards sensibly and sincerely, the meat rationing scheme having been tried out in London since Feb. 25, before having been extended to the entire country. It has worked very smoothly in the metropolis, because the drastic quality of the regulation was tempered by the common sense of the food controllers.

With the supply of meat and fats becoming irregular and even precarious, it became necessary for the food controller to resort to card rationing. The British public as a whole was not required by the use of the cards. The king's card contains, it will be noted, eight coupons, only four of which may be used in any one week. This insures his majesty a 20 weeks' supply. By the time the rest of the country with London goes on card rationing he will have sixty-four coupons left, or authority for obtaining meat for sixteen weeks.

Instruction for Use.
The detailed instructions issued recently by the food controller contain the following:

"You can use only four coupons in one week. Take your card with you when you want to buy. The shopkeeper must tear off the coupons."

"Fresh butcher's meat—You can only buy at the butcher's where you have registered. You can only use three coupons each week for butcher's meat, including pork."

"Bacon, tinned meats, poultry, etc.—You can use any of the coupons for these, and can buy them at any shop."

"Meat meals in restaurants—You can use any of the four coupons of the butcher's meat, including pork or offal, at any restaurant, canteen or eating house."

"With each coupon you must show the amount of meat set out below may be obtained:

"1—Five pennyworth of uncooked meat, including pork or offal."

"2—The following weights of other uncooked meats: Twelve and a half ounces of poultry or any bird uncooked, without feathers, but including offal; 10 ounces of rabbit or hare, uncooked, without skin but including offal; 7½ ounces without offal; 6 ounces of venison or horse-meat with bone, 6 ounces without bone; 4 ounces of uncooked ham or bacon with bone, 3 ounces without bone; 6 ounces of first quality uncooked sausages containing not less than 67 per cent of butcher's meat, including pork or offal; 6 ounces of second quality uncooked sausages containing not less than 50 per cent of butcher's meat, including pork or offal."

The ministry of food has not been very successful in attempting to deal justly with farmers and butchers as regards price fixing. The new system of one price for meat of whatever quality finds as many critics as did the abandoned system of grading. The butchers complain that the different qualities of meat with which they used to serve their customers are not now available and that now they must take what they can get. They complain that a one price regulation means that the poor man's price has been levelled up to 20 per cent, while the rich man's price has been levelled down. They instance the difference between the quality of the finer Scotch beef and the cold storage beef two years in warehouse. A meeting of the food council has been arranged for the discussion of this matter and to suggest a scheme which will be more agreeable to all concerned.

MEN OF B CLASS CALLED TO COLORS

Ottawa, Ont., March 29.—Responding to a demand from the military authorities, the military service council has decided to call up for service men in medical category "B" under the military service act.

The official memorandum follows: "A military demand for men for railway construction and other similar work has arisen, and it has therefore become necessary to draft all men in medical category 'B' in respect of whom no other grounds for exemption exist."

"The military service council is therefore issuing instructions to registrars to issue immediate steps to call up such men."

"Under the procedure heretofore adopted questions arising in regard to the exemption of men in medical category 'B' on other grounds were postponed until men in the same medical category should be called up and these men, as well as their employers and relatives, will therefore be given an opportunity of presenting claims for their exemption."

A Two-Year-Old Record.
Toronto Globe.—Preliminary reports indicate that the senior two-year-old butter record held by Alta Pouch since 1902 has at last been broken. The heifer Lakeview Dutchland Calamity Rose, owned by Dr. F. A. Heslop, Farmington, Ont., has made 29.01 pounds of butter in seven days, and at last report was still paining. It is expected that she will reach thirty pounds before her test is completed. She is a daughter of Dutchland Colossal Star, the sire of the senior three-year-old champion, Lakeview Dutchland Artis, \$4,600 pounds.
