been a falling off, owing to deaths, removals, and the great depression prevailing throughout the year. The life membership fees show a fair increase over the past year. The other sources of revenue were generally smaller than other years, but the one great financial event of the year which was of such an unusual character, viz., the collection for the erection of the Monument in St. James Cemetery, was most liberally responded to.

During the year 1,281 applicants have been relieved as far as practicable according to their various wants and requirements, and services rendered them which are sometimes of more value than even the amount of substantial

aid given.

The amount expended in this relief has been \$712,92 Orders for eleven graves for adults, and eight for children have been given in our lots in St. James Cemetery, there being now but little unoccupied space therein.

Great scarcity of employment still prevails in Toronto; it is, however, hoped and expected that an improvement

will soon take place.
