

TO THREE YEARS IN PENITENTIARY SENTENCE INFLICTED ON CONRADE SUTTER

Prisoner Made Statement to Court Describing Whole Affair—His Counsel's Address.

Conrade Sutter was on Tuesday sentenced to three years' imprisonment in the penitentiary for robbery with violence from the person of Axel Martinson on Saturday night, October 18th.

"We meaning Martinson, Hayes and myself went to Princess saloon in the afternoon, and after a few drinks there we went to the Leland house. I went in first and called for drinks, waiting for Hayes and the Swede.

"The Swede then called for another drink, and then went out to the back. Hayes said 'he's gone out,' but I replied 'he'll be back in a minute, wait a little bit and I'll be out with me, and he went out, but the Swede wasn't there.

"We started walking down the street, and Hayes suddenly said 'here's a bill.' I said 'let me look at it.' I took it and the light and saw it was a fifty.

"The prisoner was also about to tell what he did with the fifty dollar bill, but refrained from doing so in the advice of his counsel.

"The magistrate observed that many robberies were not premeditated, but this did not affect the seriousness of the crime.
