SAYS RUSSIAN GOV'T HAS REFUSED TO **MODIFY POLICY**

Berlin, Oct. 1, via Sayville.—A despatch received today by the Overseas News Agency from Stockholm says:
"Premier Goremykin of Russia, on receiving the Liberal members of the Duma and a number of Russian financiers, announced that the government would not abate an inch from the way which it considered to be the correct one. A re-opening of the legislative body, the premier said, would influence unfavorably the situation in the interior of Russia. This was especially so because of the criticisms which had been directed against bills presented by members of the left. The programme of the 'bloc' party, he added, was so unacceptable to the government that he refused to discuss it.
"The premier said it was true a majority of the Russian ministers were inclined to re-open the Duma, but they had yielded to the minority when the ministers composing it had stated their reasons.
"The declaration of the Foreign Minister was received with silence by the deputation. Russian newspapers publish the reports of the conference without comment."
