Meeting called for Wednesday night to send delegate to Provincial Convention later.

A scheme to provide retiring allowances for officials and employees of the province, the different municipalities and parishes is being talked over by those interested...

In order to have the idea properly arranged a meeting of all employees and officials of the city and county of St. John has been called for Wednesday evening next in the Court House.

The first move in getting employees and officials of St. John city and county together was made by J. King Kelley, the county secretary.

In conversation with The Standard last evening Mr. Kelley said he had arranged for the meeting Wednesday evening, and he hoped the county and city employees would take hold of the matter.

For years the question of retiring allowances for civic employees has been before the different councils, but so far no adequate scheme has been adopted.

While the provincial convention would give expression to its ideas concerning the provident fund, it was also thought that taxation systems for the province could also be considered.
