Branch of Royal Bank Estab-
lished at Canterbury —
Breaking the Fishery Laws.

Fredericton, N. B., Sept. 24.—To-
day's Royal Gazette contains notice
that letters patent have been issued in-
corporating Harry Hall Reid, of Sus-
sex, Fred Percy Kierstead, of Alma;
Edward Elmore Lewis, of Waterville,
as the Alma Supply Co., Ltd., to ac-
quire and take over as a going concern
the general mercantile business now
being carried on by Chas. T. White &
Son, Sussex. The capital stock is \$65,
000, and the head office will be at
Alma, Albert County.

Frank T. Hazel, Robert J. Foley and
Laura A. Thompson, of St. John, have
been incorporated as the Alma Bakery
Co., Ltd., with a capital stock of \$20,
000 and head office at St. John.

A branch of the Royal Bank of Can-
ada has been opened at Canterbury,
and H. W. Ferguson, who was on the
staff of the bank here before going
overseas, has been appointed manager.
Frederick P. Heckbert, of Chatham,
doing business under the firm name of
Heckbert Bros., has made an assign-
ment to Sheriff William E. Cassidy, of
Northumberland County.

COCO COLA CO. PROVIDES SUGAR FOR WINNIPEG

Eight Carolads Have Been
Placed in the Hands of the
Board of Commerce for
Distribution Through Job-
bers.

Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 24.—At this
morning's session of the Board of
Commerce, Commissioner James Auld
announced that five carloads of sugar
to relieve the shortage has been plac-
ed in the hands of eight Winnipeg
jobbers for distribution throughout
the province by the Board of Com-
merce. This sugar has been turned
over to the Board, said Mr. Auld, by
the Coca Cola Company, and is to be
sent where the need is greatest. It
is to be used solely for the purpose
of fruit preserving and not to fill ordi-
nary orders of the jobbers. Evidence
will be admitted to the board by the
firms handling the sugar to show the
nature of the distributions.

In making this announcement, Com-
missioner Auld said that the Coca
Cola Company's position had been
generally misunderstood.

"There is no doubt that the reason
for the apparent excessive supply,"
said Mr. Auld, "was due simply to their
method of buying. I do not
think there has been any suggestion
of hoarding. In view of the existing

but the jobbers have undertaken to
see that the sugar goes into the right
hands.

Railway freight agents were called
before the board this morning. The
first witness from the railways was
P. T. Andrews, freight agent of the
Canadian Pacific Railway. He stated
that from August 1 to September 23,
5,544,211 pounds of sugar arrived in
the city over the Canadian Pacific
Railway. He stated "sugar shipments
receive priority, there is no delay in
handling them."

E. W. Warner, general freight agent
of the Canadian National Railway,
said that from August 1 to date, 2,
961,076 pounds of sugar had been
shipped to Winnipeg. The freight
agent for the Grand Trunk Pacific
testified that no sugar had been re-
ceived over the line during the period
from August 1 to date.

J. Winslow, of the Security Storage
Company, the first witness called this

morning, declared there was no sugar
in storage at the companies ware-
house.

DENIKINE FORCES FORM JUNCTION WITH THE POLES

This Means a Coordinated Ef-
fort in Combatting Bolshe-
vik in Southern Russia.

Borne, Sept. 24.—The Polish press
bureau here announces that the army
of General Denikine, operating in
South Russia, has forced a junction
with the Polish forces near Kero-
stene.

If the above report should be true
it would mean that the Poles and the
anti-Bolshevik forces under Denikine
would be able to co-ordinate their ef-
forts in fighting the Bolsheviks in
South Russia.

UKRAINIANS AND POLES REQUEST FAVORS OF OTTAWA

Believe An Injustice Has
Been Done in the Arrest of
Seventeen of Their Number

Ottawa, Sept. 24.—Believing that in-
justice has been done their fellow
countrymen, the Ukrainians and Poles
of Ottawa urged the government, to-
day, to release the seventeen aliens
who were arrested in Ottawa and in-
terned without trial in May, 1918, and
who have since been prisoners in
Kapuskasung camp.

Hon. C. J. Doherty, replying to the
delegation, said he was impressed
with the representations made by the

delegation and would take the matter
into serious consideration. He added
that he would take the matter up with
the Immigration Department.
