cide that in time of prace, the rivers Amakumi and Barima shall be open to navigation by the merchant shipping of all nations, due reserve being made with regard to equitable regulations and the payment of light dues and other like imposts, on condition that the dues levied by Venezuela and British Guiana on ships traversing the parts of those rivers owned by them re-spectively shall be imposed in accord-ance with the same tariff on Venezuelan and British vessels. These tariffs are not to exceed those of all other coun-trier. The award proceeds also upon the condition that neither Venezuela nor British Guina shall impose any cus-toms duty on goods carried in vesicis, ships or boats passing through these rivers, such customs being levied only on goods landed on Venezuelan territory or on the territory of Great Britain re-spectively."
