Biographical Sketch of the Founder of the Young Men's Christian Association Organization.

ZEORGE WILLIAMS was born on a farm near Somerset, England, 1821; was converted when an apprentice at Bridgewater; entered a London business house, 1841; was powerfully impressed by the commercial slavery and spiritual neglect of men in commercial and industrial employ. Organized his fellowemployees into an Association for Bible study and Christian fellowship; was at first a Director then Treasurer; and, on the death of the Rt. Hen. Earl of Shaftsbury, President. When on a salary of £150 per annum, was accustomed to give £50 per annum to the funds of the Association; was knighted by Her Majesty Queen Victoria, June, 1894.
