

Bishop of Quebec. He was born, 27th July 1789, at Norwich, England, came to Canada, with his father, in 1793, and died after a brief illness at Bardfield his country seat on 5th Jan'y., 63. He was nineteen years Rector of Quebec and was consecrated Bishop, 14th February 1836. He was a diligent visitor among his flock. And in the dreadful visitations of cholera in 1832 and 1834 he literally lived night and day among the dying and the dead, while in 1847 when the province was visited with the plague of typhus fever, and the poor emigrants were dying by thousands at the Quarantine station, the Bishop took his turn at Grosse Isle regularly with the rest of the clergy; and again when the Cholera visited Quebec, in 1849 and 1854, he was diligent in visiting the hospitals. During many years and up to the time of his death, Bishop Mountain, besides his life membership, contributed regularly to this Society a donation equal to four annual subscriptions, and at all times he took a great interest in its proceedings.
