Has been identified with the temperance movement and the development of the Dist. of Algoma. First returned to the Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—*Sault Ste. Marie, Ont.*

FERGUSON, ROBERT (*East Kent*).

B. 1834, in Parish of Kilsyth, Stirlingshire, Scot., and ed. there. Unmarried. Is a lumberman. Has been a Councillor, Reeve and Warden of his Co. First returned to Leg. Assem., June, 1885, to fill vacancy caused by the death of the sitting mem., Mr. McCraney. Re-elected at g. e., 1886, 1890 and at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Thamesville, Co. Kent, Ont.*

FIELD, CORELLI COLLARD (*Northumberland West*).

Father and mother, natives of Somersetshire, Eng., came to Can. in 1834, and settled in Cobourg, Ont. B. in Tavistock, Devonshire, 5 Oct., 1830. M., 1859, Miss Hossack, of Cobourg. Is a merchant. Has been a Public School Trustee for sixteen years, and Chairman of the Board for twelve years, Town Councillor for ten years, and Mayor of Cobourg in 1886. Is also a Commr. of the Cobourg Town Trust. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1886, and re-elected at g. e., 1890 and 1894. A Liberal.—*Cobourg, Ont.*

FLATT, JOHN IRA (*North Wentworth*).

S. of Robert Flatt, one of the pioneer settlers of East Flamboro'. Born there 1833, and ed. in the Common School, Waterdown, Ont. Is a farmer and a lumber merchant. Has been a Councillor of West and East Flamboro' respectively, and has been Warden of the Co. of Wentworth. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g. e., 1894. A Liberal.—*East Flamboro'.*

GANEY, THOMAS, J.P. (*Grey, C.R.*).

S. of Thomas Ganey, a native of the Co. Tyrone, Irel., who came to Can. in 1834. B. in Tyrone, Irel., 1826, and ed. in the Common School. Is a farmer and a J.P. Was
