

Registrar General of Canada, and Supdt. General of Indian Affairs. Is a commissioner to assist Mr. Speaker in the management of the internal economy of the House of Commons. Created C.B. (Civil) by Her Majesty, 1868. Created a *Chevalier Commandeur* of the Roman order of Pope Gregory the Great, 1870. Introduced two measures in 1863, one fixing the rate of interest at eight per cent.; the other to cause capital punishment to be inflicted in jail-yards; both passed in Assembly, but were stopped in Upper House by dissolution of Parliament. Sat for present seat in L.A., Can., from g. e., 1857, until the Union. Returned to Commons at last g.e. by acclamation. Represents Dorchester in Local House. A Conservative.—*Corner of St Lewis and St. Ursule Sts., Quebec; Russell House, Ottawa; Stadacona Club; Rideau Club.*

B. at St. Laurent, Island of Orleans, P.Q. Ed. at the Seminary of Quebec. M., March, 1870, Mary Josephine, 2nd dau. of the Hon John Sandfield Macdonald, Q.C., M.P., Attorney General for Ontario. Called to the Bar, L.C., May, 1847. Created Q.C., 1867. Is a mem. of the extensive law firm of Langlois, Angers & Colston. Was Professor of Criminal Law in Laval University (from which he obtained degree of LL.D.) from 1858 to 1867. First returned to Parlt. Sept., 1867, for present seat, on resignation of sitting mem. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir G. E. Cartier.—*Quebec; Rideau Club.*
