insurance; a careful study of methods of electoral reform, including the alternative vote and proportional representation; a reduction in the costs of elections; limitation of central campaign funds and the publication of campaign contributions.

Meny other subjects will present themselves to yourminds, but these are among the ones to which the party proposes to give special attention. By means of a continuous interchange of ideas and opinions thus secured, and free and full discussion at annual meetings of the Association, the parliamentary party will, it is expected, be kept more closely in touch with opinion throughout the country, and Liberals, in all sarts of Canada, more fully informed the Liberal point of view on the issues of the day.
