Dear Mr. Meighen:

In acknowledging with grateful appreciation your letter of March 30th, may I state at once that my reason in avoiding further details in my letter of March 27th was prompted by a desire for brevity and to avoid boredom.

I now wish to state that my sole ambition for the future is to obtain a position of responsible trust under our Federal Government and in connection with accumulation and supervision of material for the St. Lawrence Seaways project, if and when this undertaking materializes. Making this request as I do with all feelings of assured ability and character, which my record of two positions in 26 years in this class of employment firmly establishes. However, my chief anxiety for the moment is to obtain some kind of temporary employment which would enable me to continue to support my family and it is with this end in view that friends in Toronto, at present, are strenuously endeavoring to get me placed.

I have been given to understand that considerable vacancies occur from time to time in the License Department of Inland Revenue. I have also been informed that there would be good prospects of a position under the Ontario Liquor Control Board, if I had a boost from yourself.

The Hon. Chas. McCrear's request for substantiation of my statement made to him and to yourself covering my political activities and standing in the West I venture to suggest you might safely comply with, and once again sincerely apologizing for thus troubling you, which is solely prompted by the stress of present trying times, I am, with kindest personal regards to yourself.
