circulation of Oxford University
pamphlets.

I have read these proposals with care. If the Reynolds firm intends to embark upon them singlehanded, there will be a great duplication of effort which is at present being carried on, properly in my view, by professional rather than by commercial bodies.

The proposals include a "Committee on Public Education and Enlightenment to sponsor (for the Canadian Government) the larger distribution of the Oxford Pamphlets. The Canadian Institute of International Affairs already has a Committee on Public Information, with which various other organizations, notably the Canadian Association for Adult Education and the League of Nations Society in Canada, are co-operating closely. It would clearly be undesirable to attempt to establish any new Committee without taking account of these existing agencies. They are, in turn, in a much better position, through past experience, to undertake speaking tours, work in schools, radio broadcasts, and the sponsoring of a Canadian series of pamphlets or purely Canadian problems.

The Reynolds proposals touch all these latter points, but make no mention of establishing agencies.
