

officers at the posts most convenient for Agents Martineau, Reader and McKay to receive from them any such money that they may have after the payments, and that he will upon presentation of Receipts (which might be brought down by the Pay Clerks), from his officers for the same, deposit the amount thereof to the credit of the Receiver General on account of Indian funds and send the Bank certificate and draft to you.

If this arrangement cannot be made, the money should be forwarded by the first mail, as the Department considers that it would be an unnecessary expense to bring the Agents to Winnipeg with it; and it would be improper to
