September.—We are glad to know that our farmers are alive to the value of a good orchard. In respect to the proper time for planting there are differences of opinion. If the soil is light and moderately dry, and the locality not too far north, trees may be safely planted in the fall, provided they are of the most hardy kind, such as apples, pears and plums. Taking all things into consideration we prefer early spring to Autumn. But the trees should always be dug up in the autumn and transported to the place where they are to be planted, and then carefully heeled in. It may be well enough to cover the entire stems with earth, if received very late in the season. In heeling in the roots, the roots should be covered quite deep, so that at least a foot or more of the stems will be covered. If there is any danger from frost, shade the trees with evergreens.
