# HOMESTEAD

# REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoha or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been home-seaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other pur-poses, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-uarter section of 160 acres, more or less. or less.

### ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken is

s'tuate, or if the homesteader de sires he may, on application to the Minister of the Intertor, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winninge, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee

entry. of \$10 is charged for a homestead HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted as entry for a homestend is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans.— (I) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each years during the term of three years.

Asymmute of connecting A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clausses (2) (6) or (4) must cultivate 80 acress of his bonestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their ac-commodation, and have besides 50 acress substantially fenced. Every homestender who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestender law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homesteal In-spector. Before making application for patient the settler must give air Commissioner of Dominion Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
