Work the Farm Harder



#### MR. GRISDALE'S CROP ROTATION SYSTEM

The division of a farm as it would look under hit. Grisdale's system, is shown in the above cut. In the upper right hand corper is the portion set aside for soiling crops and or which, a three year rotation is followed. The lower half of the diagrams shows the four division of the farm, on which the four year rotation is followed. All farms, of course, could not be divided exactly like this one. The system of rotation here shown, however, is applicable to any farm

Mr. Grisdale considered pasture an expensive way of feeding cattle in summer . Silage was the best summer food, but if that could not be had, then summer soiling must be resorted then summer soiling must be resorted to in order that the pasturage might be supplemented with some forage crop.
