Yet the faid Simon Z. Watson, Returning Officer aforesaid, difregarding such a demand, and acting with gross injustice, and partiality in favour of the faid Stephen Sewell, Elquire, the then ablent Candidate, refused to close and determine the said election; and did proceed to a continuation of the fame, by precipitating and feeking the admission of voters, contrary and in contravention to his duty; whereof the petitioner, and the said Jean Antoine Panet, Esquire, represented as aforesaid, did, and do now, most solemnly and fincerely protest. Wherefore the petitioner most humbly prays, that this House may order the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, to produce the Writ of Return, of the said Election, and that the same be amended, by erafing the name of Stephen Sewell, Esquire, returned as duly elected. and substituting that of the petitioner — The petitioner further complains of Stephen Sewell, Esquire, one of the Members returned for the faid County, that in contravention to the Provincial Statute, in fuch cases made and provided, and in a manner repugnant to the Statutes of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain, did by himself. and by the means of others, menace, intimidate and diffuade, a number of legal electors of the faid County, from attending the faid poll. held at St. Philip aforesaid, and giving their votes in favour of the petitioner. That the faid Stephen Sewell, Esquire, did further by himfelf, and by the means of others in his interest and favour, make use of, and employ, divers means of bribery and corruption, whereby to procure voters. That the faid Stephen Sewell, Esquire, did further keep, or cause to be kept, at his own proper cost and charges, a house of public entertainment, wherein voters for the said Stephen Serv. ell. Elquire, were openly invited, during the faid election, whereby the free choice of the electors, was perverted. Wherefore the petitioner most humbly further prays, that this House may find sufficient grounds, to declare and adjudge the faid election, for the faid County. to be corrupt and void, and that the faid Stephen Sewell, Efquire, be declared incapable of holding a leat in this present Parliament. The petitioner further complains of Simon Z. Watson, Esquire, the Returning Officer, duly appointed for the faid County, that he the faid Simon
