A Message from the Council by Mr. Hill

Mr Speaker

The Council have agreed to the Bill, entitled, An Act in amendment of an Act, made and passed in the thirty-second year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, entitled, An Act relating to Wills, Legacies and Executors, and for the Settlement and Distribution of the Estates of Intestates.

Also, to the Bill entitled, An Act in addition to and amendment of an Act, passed in third year of the Reign of His late Majesty George the Third, entitled, An Act to prevent Nuisances, by Hedges, Wears, and other Incumbrances, obstructing the passage of Fish in the Rivers in this Province.

Also, to the Bill, entitled, An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned for the service of the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty-nine, and for appropriating such part of the Supplies, granted in this Session of the General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province, severally without amendment.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

On motion, *resolved*, That the Sheriff of the County of Halifax, be authorised immediately on the Prorogation of this present Session of the General Assembly, to discharge from Prison John Alexander Barry, and Frederick Major, now Prisoners in the Common Gaol at Halifax, under the orders of this House.

On motion of Mr. Uniacke, *resolved unanimously*, that, as Charles R. Fairbanks, Esquire, a Member of this House, is about proceeding to England, as Agent for the Shubenacadie Canal Company, that Mr. Speaker be requested, in behalf of this House, to solicit from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor an introduction of that Gentleman to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies.

A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by Mr. Secretary George :

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor commands this House to attend His Excellency immediately in the Council Chamber.
