I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until **WEDNESDAY**, the Thirty-first day of **DECEMBER**, instant, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of this Island, at Charlottetown, in the said Island, this Second day of December, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.
