Hamilton, Galt and Montreal Will Arm An Effective Force

BIG RUSH OF MEN WANTING TO ENLIS'

Church Lads' Brigade, Of Montreal, Offers Its Service

Ottawa, Aug. 8.—The Imperial Government to-day cabled its acceptance of the offer of Hamilton, Gault and Montreal to raise and equip a regiment of 10,000 men, all having seen active service.

This regiment, as already announced will be over and above the contingent of 20,000 which will be sent as Canada's contribution.

Lieut. Col. E. D. Farguhar, D.S.O. Military Secretary to H.R.H. Governor Geal, will command the Montreal regiment and Capt. Buller, C.A.D.F., to His Royal Highness, will act in the capacity of Adjutant.

Montreal, Aug. 8.-Montrea 1 has been asked by the Minister of Militia to send about 4500 men to the front Three thousand infantry are wanted for the artillery division, and probably a number of between 500 and 1000 more. Only a few cavalry, probably between 500 and 400 are needed, but in addition there will be various branches of the service to bring up the total.
