SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
THE sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Land Agency that act Sub-Agency, on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of the years a homesteader may live within land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A homestead house is not exempt where residence is performed in the vicinity.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$8.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years, after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Proportion patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$25.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$100.00.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
