Until preventive measures became effective, countless millions of mice were devastating the wheat crop in Australia, according to Chas. Neunhoffer of Melbourne, now visiting in the States. The farmers used poison, water and even gas and every other means that suggested itself in their desperate effort to eliminate the pest, their afforts proving fairly successheir efforts proving fairly succes

ful.

"The crops are not unusually heavy," said Mr. Neunhoffer, who spent several days at Dodge Brothers' Works in Detroit, "but there are no facilities for handling them. Ships—this is the country's most crying need to-day. Until tonnage is provided it is useless for the farmers to complete their harvesting, as it requires only a small percentage on the crops to supply the domestic demand. 
