

Advocates Imperial Unity. A gentleman who has taken great interest in colonial development, and who is a strong supporter of the imperialistic idea, Sir Frederick Young, K.C.M.G., of London, England, is at present a visitor in the city, a guest of Dr. Parkin, Principal of Upper Canada College.

In making a decision his lordship said he was entirely against the supplementary list and held that it was illegal and should not be considered. Final judgment will be rendered Tuesday at 11 o'clock.

Shortly after the formation of the Royal Colonial Institute in London, Sir Frederick was appointed honorary secretary. Then there was a membership of only two hundred, now the association numbers between four and five thousand of the most distinguished men in the empire.

Apart from his work in connection with the colonies Sir Frederick has a reputation in the literary field. One of his publications, "A Winter Tour in South Africa," was published in 1899, and a contribution, "East Party," is an essay on the rise and fall of party in the governments of Great Britain from the time of King John to the present day.
