Berwick, June 20—The death took place quite suddenly on Monday morning at her home in Somerset, Kings County, of Mrs. Arabelle Elizabeth Calder. Although she had been ill for some time her friends did not realize that she was so near her end, and her death caused a great shock to her friends. She leaves a son John and a daughter Maria. The funeral takes place tomorrow afternoon.

When he could get no answer from those candidates it is certainly pure and lofty politics to condemn him for not publishing an answer. Kings County resents such reflections against its honored ministers.
