JAS. ROSS, OF ATHENS, ENTERS ACTION FOR \$5,000

Against B. W. & N. Railway for Injuries Sustained in Accident Last Winter

Mr. James Ross, sowing machine agent of Athens, has just entered an action for \$5000 damages against the B. W. & N. Railway for injuries sustained while riding on one of the company's trains last winter. It will be remembered one evening last January, while the regular train was returning from Westport, and reaching a point about a mile and a half west of Lyn, the passenger coaches left the track and laid up against the embankment. Mr. Ross, who was coming to Brockville in his official capacity as D.D.G.M. of the A.O.U.W., was injured by being cut over one eye. The injury was dressed, and he arrived here during the evening, and attended the meeting.

When seen this morning, Mr. W. S. Buell, solicitor for the Railway Company, said they would be prepared to fight the action, which would likely be brought up at the fall assizes in September.

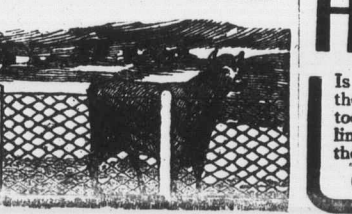
