UNITED STATES. Two new cases of smallpox were reported in Meriden, Conn., Friday.

President Harrison has authorized an expenditure of \$3,000 on the Dakota Indians.

On Wednesday, at Fulton, Ky., D. E. Brooks murdered Calvin Clements, his step-son.

An ingenious counterfeit of one dollar silver certificates has been arrested in Chicago.

At Butte, Mont., Thomas Bryant, 16 years of age, murdered his mother. He was arrested.

Parwell & Co.'s extensive dry goods establishment in Chicago was destroyed by fire loss, \$475,000.

Congress will probably vote \$35,000 to relieve the prevailing destitution among the Dakota redskins.

Ben Jones, a farmer of Rome, N. Y., was smothered to death under a falling load of hay on Wednesday night.

The fourth trial of the Navassa rioters in the United States Court at Baltimore resulted in the conviction of 23 rioters.

Gen. John A. Foster, formerly Brigadier General of the American army, died in New York from the effects of whiskey.

The canned goods packers of Indiana have perfected a national organization. A National Convention will be held at Baltimore May 1st.

The bodies of an old couple named Jones were found riddled with bullets in a heap of refuse on their farm, six miles from Onahla, Neb.

Indian students attending school at Carlisle, Pa., have contributed \$500 towards the fund to relieve their starving brethren in Dakota.

Kansas City brokers and ticket "scalpers" have been detected in wholesale forgeries by means of which they obtained railway tickets at reduced rates.

A railroad election fight in Wichita, Kansas, engaged a hundred men with guns and knives on Thursday, and two men were fatally wounded.

A sub-committee of Congress has been appointed to have charge of all questions bearing upon reciprocity between the United States and Canada.

From jealousy a farmer named McBride, of Iowa, Tex., shot and killed E. McNew, his brother-in-law, on Wednesday, and then attempted to murder his wife.

The Congressional House Committee on Territories decided to report favorably on Delegate Carey's bill for the admission of the Territory of Wyoming as a State.

Mrs. M. Newton, of Everton, Penn., on Thursday gave birth to four girls. They are of ordinary size, perfectly formed and will live. Mr. and Mrs. Newton are both of Irish birth.

The United States Senate has eliminated the clause in the Russian Extradition Treaty which would exempt from the list of political crimes attempts upon the life of the Emperor or any member of his family.

In the British Extradition Treaty objections is being made in the United States Senate to the clauses providing extradition for persons charged with manslaughter and obtaining money under false pretenses.

At Chicago, Robt. Henderson, a member of the Rev. D. L. Moody's congregation, shot Miss Hattie Hind, a member of the choir, in the face and then committed suicide.

Henderson had deserted his family, and Miss Hind was reproving him at the historic St. Paul's Church, where Washington was whipped, and where religious exercises of the Centennial were held, when she was shot.
