Ottawa, Feb. 20.—A reflection of public opinion upon the developments in the Farmers' Bank case was given in the banking and commerce committee this morning when Mr. Knowles' bill to incorporate the Hudson's Bay mortgage corporation was under consideration. On the organizing clause, the suggestion was made by Samuel Barker, Hamilton, that at least half of the proposed capital of \$100,000 should be deposited in cash in some chartered bank prior to organization.
