

## TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

**CANADIAN BUDGET CARRIED.**  
OTTAWA, May 20.  
The Budget motion in the House of Commons was carried early this morning after an all night sitting, by a vote of 103 to 85. An amendment proposed by Hon. W. S. Fielding, was defeated on the same division.

## A PRESENT TO CANADIAN COMMONS.

OTTAWA, May 20.  
The Right Hon. J. W. Lowther, former Speaker of the British House of Commons, this afternoon presented to the House of Commons of Canada a Speaker's Chair, which is the gift of the United Kingdom British Empire Parliamentary Association. Lowther said: "The acceptance of this Chair by me acknowledges the great principle that British people, whether in the United Kingdom or Dominions, accept Parliamentary Government and Parliamentary institutions, by which free people can govern themselves."

## THE STRIKE SITUATION.

LONDON, May 20.  
(Canadian Associated Press)—To-day marked the fiftieth day of the Miners' Strike. Unofficial parleys involving much running into the country by leaders of miners, to meet members of the federation. It is reported that mine owners have offered a new scheme to the men through the mediation of the Government. The Times editorial to-day protests against the owners' standpoint, that only by reductions in wages can industry be made to pay. It says, "everyone is now beginning to understand that reform of managerial methods on the one hand and a better output on the other must accompany cuts in wages. If industry is to be put on its feet again, imported coal is being landed at Folkestone, Leith, Middlesbrough and Portland. George Roberts, Labor MP, and former Food Controller, speaking last night, said the strike had been prolonged because of the cowardice of miners' leaders in not telling the truth. The men would return to work within a fortnight, with conditions they could have had long ago, simply by going into a colliery. Four million tons of idle shipping are lying in British ports. The dispute has knocked the bottom out of the London season, and a financial slump has occurred, which is the worst in many years."

## ONE IDEA OF WARFARE.

CORK, May 20.  
Three former soldiers on their way to work to-day were taken by a man to a stone quarry, and one of them was shot dead, another was seriously wounded and the third slightly wounded.

## THE WEEK'S WAR.

DUBLIN, May 20.  
An official review of the week, issued by the Dublin Castle authorities, says crime statistics were exceptionally large. There were sixty attacks on Crown forces, while the police suffered fifty-five casualties, of which 22 resulted in death. Most of the attacks occurred on the day following the general election. The review, however, for a Southern Irish Parliament, and according to the review, were the outcome of a plan prepared during the week there were 21 raids on mails and twelve attacks on police barracks. The number of persons interned now totals 3,038.

## STOWAWAY PROTEST.

SYDNEY, N.S., May 20.  
Charges of ill-treatment against officers of the steamer "Winona" made by three stowaways, George, Porlow, Thomas Johnston, and James Kennedy, who were arrested here to-day by the police have been investigated by the authorities. The men are being held for deportation to Newfoundland.

## WARM WELCOME FOR AQUITANIA.

NEW YORK, May 20.  
Police reserves and sympathizers of the striking marine clashed to-night at the Cunard pier during a street demonstration, while the Aquitania docked. The reserves, paraded in front of piers, with banners denouncing liner's stewards, many of whom were clerks in Liverpool office of the Company, who had taken the places of stewards to make the voyage. Stones were hurled at the police, who fired several shots in the air to disperse the crowd.

## COURAGE ILLUSTRATED.

CORK, May 20.  
While the main thoroughfare at Corc, near Kinsale, was crowded this evening, several revolver shots were fired, and a number of bombs thrown. Many civilians, soldiers and sailors were badly wounded. The authors are unknown.
