Find of Sapphires

OPENED IN CEYLON FIELD.

COLOMBO, June 17.—The largest
sapphires ever made in Cey-
lon in the world, is reported
to be found in a paddy field
near Palamadulla, about 50 miles
from Colombo. The find is in a paddy
field of about two acres.
Sapphires include yellow, gold,
blue and blue stones varying in
size from 20 to 700 carats. Some of
the report states, weigh about
one pound and are marvellous in
size. One of the best known Colombo
jewellers in precious stones declares
it an unprecedented one, but

thinks the stones are too large. What
dealers now want in sapphires are
stones that weigh between 4 and 20
carats, as the demand for large pen-
dants is gone, as are the days when
crowned heads and wealthy collectors
would pay high prices for a single
stone.

Some of the stones found have
been valued at about \$75,000, rough
polished. One sapphire, perfect, in
every respect, of excellent quality
and color, free from flaw and cut per-
fectly, sold for \$250 a carat.

The largest finished sapphire ever
set out of Ceylon was one sold to the
late J. Pierpont Morgan in 1908. This
stone, said to be the largest, in the
world, was found at Gurawita Korale
near Ratnapura in 1908, and weighed
460 carats after being cut and
polished.

The find in the paddy field has
caused a sensation in Colombo and
has attracted many visitors to the
place where sapphires are still being
taken out, the yield being practically
unlimited.

Household Notes

Be sure that the fish you purchase
in warm weather is perfectly fresh.
It is a wise rule to use a plain rug
with printed curtains, and vice versa.
Serve veal kidneys with melted but-

Mix all the dry ingredients of salad
dressing before adding any liquids.
A shallow copper bowl is most ef-
fective for arranging very delicate
blooms.
If silk shows milky stains, soak
it in sour milk for twelve hours, rinse
and sun.
Chopped celery to be used in salad

should be bleached in water to which
a little lemon juice has been added.
Garnish a broiled beefsteak with
broiled mushroom caps and halved
tomatoes.
The housewife appreciates the dain-
ty service that covered bouillon cups
afford.
Aluminum utensils are generally
considered most "practical" for the

camp cooking.
On your camping trip carry a re-
liable flashlight or an unbreakable
folding lantern.
Eggplant, sliced, dipped in melted
butter and broiled is nice on a hot
sea-food platter.
Stuff green pepper cases with bread-
crumbs seasoned with a little chill
sauce and bake.

If your ice cream and frozen cus-
tards are coarse grained the freezing
has been too rapid.
The pulp left when making currant
jelly can be combined with raisins in
a delicious jam.
Sponge cake is nice flavored with
chocolate. Heat the milk and choco-
late together and cool before using.
A few chopped green peppers and

A little tomato give a nice flavor to
scrambled eggs. Garnish with bacon.
Tomato cases are nice stuffed with
shredded crab-meat or shrimps, and
serve on lettuce with mayonnaise.
Serve hot gingerbread, with sweet-
ened whipped cream.
